F.A.S.T. Presentations 1 in 6 people in NZ experience a many people stroke in their lifetime and all so pressure, Pulse and often either symptoms recognized or people don't recognize it as being an emergency and don't call the ambulance straight away. This means treatment will not be administered fast enough and the consequences can lead to severe disability and even death.

After a few minutes without oxygen and food from your blood, your brain is started within a few hours. permanent damage can be avoided.

It is not just the physical benefits, but the mental benefits as well. Just to get out into the fresh air is in my opinion, and mine only, reason enough to get a garden started. More on this subject as the article continues. But, please be kind. Although I am pretty thick skinned, I do have feelings.

"Summer In Your Gardens": Summer & Spring are my most favourite times of the year whether for gardening or life in general. I feel it brings out the best in most people. And it is the start in earnest for my gardening for the rest of the year. By that I mean it is the time when I plant everything for the freezer or for the making of preserves. In future articles I will be adding just one recipe per season for you to try, whether you have a garden or not. Nothing quite beats homemade

Stroke Foundation New Zealand two pronged.

The Stroke Foundation of NZ held their first full staff meeting in 3 years (since Covid), down in Christchurch over 4 days in October. They kindly invited the whole Stroke Central NZ staff and CEO to join them and take part in their workshops, awards dinner and team building activities.

It was a privilege for SCNZ staff to be there and provided a real insight into the Stroke Foundations community work, health promotion plans and future growth as an organisation. What became clear was that the Stroke Foundation's work focuses just as much on the stroke survivors, their families and local communities as our work does.

In the past few months SCNZ has worked closely with the Stroke Foundation on various projects; F.A.S.T. Presentations and Education, Blood Pressure Vans and the Take Charge After Stroke Program. This collaboration has been well received by our staff as well as health/stroke professionals around our region.

We are now looking at a potential amalgamation between our organi-

Firstly our financial status is in such a deficit that by 2024 if spending will continue as before, SCNZ would be insolvent. Our current 2021/2022 financial deficit is \$153.807 and there is not enough regional funding available to see this change in the near future.

Secondly, the healthcare environment is moving towards dealing with a single national body, rather than with dealing various regional organisations. Working as a united organisation will give us greater influence and authority with Te Whatu Ora (Health NZ) and the Government when advocating for more funding and greater support for stroke survivors and their families in Aotearoa.

A special General Meeting via Zoom will be held on Saturday the 3rd of Dec 10:30am for people to ask questions to the Board and CEO (see p.10 for Zoom Details).
